What is the Infant Mortality Consortium?

- A collaborative effort led by HSE-SB to address social determinants of health impacting birth outcomes.
- Monthly meetings with virtual participation options to ensure inclusivity and opportunities for action planning and training sessions.

Who Can Participate?

- Individuals with lived experience with birth, parenting, pregnancy/infant loss.
- Anyone planning to become pregnant
- SB County residents, clinics, community centers, faith-based organizations, hospital systems, birth workers, and other community partners.
- HSE-SB program participants (current and graduates).
- Individuals passionate about improving perinatal health outcomes.

What Will You Do?

- Collaborate on actionable projects targeting critical social determinants of health.
- Contribute ideas, expertise, and resources to develop comprehensive solutions.

Benefits of Participation:

- Access to training opportunities on legislative advocacy, housing initiatives, and more.
- Networking opportunities with like-minded diverse community members, organizations and experts.
- Stipends available for active participation to honor participants' time and commitment (Available to HSE-SB program participants only).
